Term 2	1347 – 1485 (pp. 230 – 285, chapters 48 through 59)

Term 4	1588 – 1685 (pp. 342 – 393, chapters 72 through 82)
Term 5	1685 – 1789 (pp. 394 – 452, chapters 83 through 96)
Term 6	1789 – 1901 (pp. 453 – 514, chapters 97 through 110)
